Introduction and Data Quality Statement


This report contains findings from selected questions from the Survey of Adult Carers in England, 2016-17 (SACE) in the North West. This national survey takes place every other year and is conducted by Councils with Adult Social Services Responsibilities (CASSRs).

The survey seeks the opinions of carers aged 18 or over, caring for a person aged 18 or over, on a number of topics that are considered to be indicative of a balanced life alongside their unpaid caring role.

The report analyses the North West Local Authorities against the national average, and compares the 2016/17 results with those from the previous two surveys, which took place in 2014/15 and 2012/13.

In terms of data quality, please note that as this is based on a survey, sent to a sample of carers who are known to the Local Authority only and the figures may not fully represent the total carers population in the region.

Also, when analysing the data as the regional level, there were almost 9,000 completed surveys, which is a high number. Therefore, any anomalies will be less prominent when analysing the region data. However, the chart below shows that some LA's have a very small number of responses on which to base the results on – therefore percentage changes and anomalies effect individual LA's results much more prominently.



Key Points

Some of the high level **<u>REGIONAL</u>** key points within this report are:

- Carers satisfaction in the North West appears to be declining when compared to previous surveys. Nearly 78% of respondents gave positive feedback in 2012/13, but this has dropped to 71% in 2016/17. However, this is replicated nationally, so the North West is far from an outlier in this regard;
- It appears that carers are now caring for slightly younger people than they previously have been. The person care for aged group of 85+ is seeing continual decreases, whereas 18-64 is seeing increases;
- Carers having as much social contact with people they like is declining in the North West, and this appears to be a particular issue across Liverpool City Region and Greater Manchester;
- Approximately 40% of carers feel they are always consulted and involved in the decisions that relate to the support of their cared for person; this is almost identical to the National Average;
- Nearly 60% of carers in the North West are retired. Of those who do work, less and less people feel that they have support from their employer, but despite this decline, we are still better than the National Average;
- Over 20% of carers in the North West have been caring for more than 20 years, with 40% caring for more than 10 years. Also, the majority of them care for 100+ hours per week, and the percentage that fall into the 100+ hours per week is increasing with every survey.

Sub Regional Key Points

CHESHIRE

- All three Cheshire Local Authorities of Cheshire East, Cheshire West and Chester, and Warrington are all above the national average for carers satisfaction. However, Warrington and Cheshire West and Chester did see a noticeable reduction for those who gave a positive response to the satisfaction question.
- In terms of information being 'very easy to find', performance does range a lot within a small sub region. Warrington was the second best performing Local Authority in the region at 28%, but Cheshire East was one of the lowest at just 13%.
- However, on the flip side, Warrington performed poorly in terms of carers being involved in any discussions about the services their cared for person receives, but Cheshire East were above the England average and were the highest in Cheshire.

GREATER MANCHESTER

• Carers having as much social contact with people they like appears to be an issue in Greater Manchester. Seven of the ten Local Authorities are performing at a lower level than the National Average, and nine out the ten had worse performance than the 2014/15 survey;

- Also, in terms of carers being involved in any discussions regarding their cared for person's services, six out of the ten were below the National Average, with the bottom three Local Authorities in the region all being GM;
- In terms of the carer having as much control of their daily life as they would like, eight of the ten Greater Manchester Local Authorities were performing at a very similar level, at an average of 24%. However, neighbouring Local Authorities of Bury and Bolton were outliers, where Bolton were one of the best in the region at over 29%, and Bury were the worst at just 14%.

LANCASHIRE AND CUMBRIA


- Generally, carers satisfaction was higher in Lancashire and Cumbria than anywhere else in the North West Region, with Blackburn being the highest Local Authority;
- In other areas of analysis, the Lancashire and Cumbria sub region also performed well (in the North West Region context). This is illustrated when looking at all Local Authorities performance for: carers satisfaction, having control of their daily life, being able to look after themselves, having as much social contact as they like, being able to find information and advice, and the usefulness of that information and advice; only twice out twenty four possibilities did a Lancashire and Cumbria LA fall into the bottom quartile.


LIVERPOOL CITY REGION

- As with GM, carers having as much social contact with people they like appears to be an issue in the Liverpool City Region. Five out of the six Local Authorities are performing at a lower level than the National Average, and four had worse performance than the 2014/15 survey;
- Carers being able to look after themselves also appears to be an issue in the City Region. Of the six Local Authorities that make up the bottom quartile, four of them are LCR Local Authorities;
- In most cases, Halton does appear to be the outlier within the Liverpool City Region, as it has much better figures than the other five Local Authorities.

Where we have excellent performance in the national context:


- BLACKBURN and HALTON are noticeably higher than the other Local Authorities for carers satisfaction these two Local Authorities are second and fourth best **nationally**;
- CHESHIRE WEST & CHESTER, ROCHDALE AND BLACKBURN are all in the top 10 nationally for carers having as much social contact as they want, with the people they like;
- In terms of information and advice being very easy to find, ST HELENS was ranked fourth nationally. However, <u>half of the top 10 Local Authorities for this were from the North West</u>. The other four included: WARRINGTON, BOLTON, HALTON and SALFORD;
- In terms of how useful information and advice is, again ST HELENS was ranked fourth nationally, with HALTON also being in the top 10.





The chart above shows that based on the data from the survey, it appears that carers are caring for slightly younger individuals than in previous years, although despite this, when the 65-74, 75-84 and 85+ age groups are aggregated into 65+, then these far outweigh the 18-64 age group.

The most noticeable decline is in the 85+ age group, where 29% of people who responded in 2012/13 cared for someone aged 85+, but this has now dropped to 22%.



When splitting all of the age groups, it does show that there hasn't been too much variance from year to year, with the exception of the 85+ age group. Back in 2012/13, 85+ was the most commonly selected age group within the survey, but for the past two surveys it has been 75-84 years old.




The chart (left) compares the North West to the national average in **2016/17 only**.

It can be seen that the North West has a slightly higher percentage of people caring for 18-64 Service Users, and slightly less 85+.

The table above shows that there has been a noticeable drop in carers caring for people for **problems connected to ageing**. Whilst the percentage is still relatively high at over one third, it is still a large drop from almost 41% in 2012/13. There has also been a slight drop for those relating to sight or hearing loss, but a similar sized increase for those with dementia.



Generally, the North West data mirrors the national data closely. In most areas, the North West has a lower percentage than the National Average (multiple answers can be selected in this question), although the North West is slightly higher for those with a Mental Health problem and Alcohol or Drug Dependency.

In terms of Problems Connected to Ageing, the national data shows a reduction in this too, but not as big a reduction as the North West. The national data has a reduction of 5.9%, whereas the North West reduced by 6.9%.

Question 4 - Overall, how satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the support or services you and the person you care for have received from Social Services in the last 12 months?



* Please note for the purpose of the second table, a positive response is I am extremely, very or quite satisfied, and a negative is I am extremely, very or quite dissatisfied.

The tables above show that generally, people responded positively to the satisfaction question, although this positivity is on the decline, with neutral and negative responses up slightly, however, as the chart below shows, this is a trend that is replicated nationally.



Two Local Authorities in the region scored particularly highly with regards to a positive response, and these were **Blackburn** and **Halton** (further breakdown is on the following page). These both had a positive response from more than 80% of carers surveyed, much higher than the North West and national average.


The table below shows the percentage of responses that resulted in a positive comment, per Local Authority in each sub region.

The data shows that in Greater Manchester, seven of the ten Local Authorities saw a noticeable decline (for the purpose of the table, this is a reduction of 3% or more compared to 2014/15), with the largest decline regionally being in Sefton, Trafford and Manchester.


Despite Cheshire West & Chester and Warrington seeing noticeable drops, the Cheshire sub region is the only one where all Local Authorities were outperforming the national average.

The chart below is an overview of what percentage of respondents said they were **extremely dissatisfied** with the support/services they had received.

The greatest was in Manchester with 6.4% of respondents, but despite Cheshire West and Chester being mentioned previously for being above national average for positivity, they are second highest in the region for extremely dissatisfied carers.



The final chart relating to Q4 summarises all of the responses per Local Authority in 2016/17.



The table above shows the services used by the cared for person, and the most noticeable reduction was in Home Care/Home Help. There was an almost 5% reduction here, but this was a trend that was replicated nationally too.

Carers breaks have only seen slight reductions, with approximately one fifth of carers using them to allow them to have a break for more than 24 hours. There was a large variance across the region for this though, where 40% of Blackpool's and Bolton's carers using breaks of more than 24 hours, but just 10% of Oldham's.


In terms of the bottom option, 'they are permanently resident in a care home', 10% was almost identical to the national average, but like the carers breaks above, there was a large variance across the region. For example, in Cheshire West and Chester over 21% of respondents said that their cared for person was in a permanent care home placement, whereas in Blackpool it was less than 2%.

Question 6 – Have you used any of the support or services listed, to help you as a carer over the last 12 months?



In terms of services used by the carers, Information and Advice was the most common in all three years, although this is on a slight decline. However, support from carers groups is slightly up to 34%, which is better than the national average at 31%.

Question 11 – Thinking about how much social contact you've had with people you like, which of the following statements best describes your social situation?

From the data above it appears that social isolation may be an issue with carers in the North West, however, that said, the percentage who have little social contact and feel isolated has been <u>lower</u> in the North West than the national average in all of the last three surveys.

In terms of those who responded 'I have as much social contacts as I want with people I like', Local Authorities such as Cheshire West and Chester, Blackburn and Rochdale scored particularly highly here. However, three bordering Local Authorities of Liverpool, Knowsley and Sefton were noticeably lower than the regional and national averages.



Question 14 – In the last 12 months, has your health been affected by your caring role in any of the ways listed below?




Please note that this is a new question for the 2016/17 survey and therefore cannot be compared to previous years.

It is clear from the chart above that the North West follows a very similar trend to the rest of the country, but it is also clear that for those who responded, being a carer had a negative impact on most people's health in one way or another. Just 10% said that none of the list had impacted them, meaning 9 out 10 people were affected.

Caring for a Service User appeared to have an impact on the carers sleep in three quarters of cases, and almost a third of respondents had to visit their GP.


Question 15 – In the last 12 months, has caring caused you any financial difficulties?



Please note that this is a new question for the 2016/17 survey and therefore cannot be compared to previous years.

It can be seen that the North West follows the national average identically. Whilst more than half don't suffer financially, 10% do state that they do a lot. Although the data cannot specifically be linked, this may also be a cause of some of the medical issues in Q14 above.


Question 16 – In the last 12 months, have you found it easy or difficult to find information and advice about support, services or benefits?


Although not depicted on the chart above, it must be known that the North West has consistently been better than the National Average for those who said it was very easy to find the information and advice about support. However, the chart does show that those who feel it has become very difficult to find is increasing slightly.

Question 18 – In the last 12 months, do you feel you have been involved or consulted as much as you wanted to be, in discussions about the support or services provided to the person you care for?



% who were involved in discussions:

Before analysing the carer's level of involvement in the discussions/consultation, the chart above highlights what percentage where discussions took place (higher is better). Nationally, 70% of carers felt that they had at least been involved in discussions, where this was only 66% in the North West.

However, the chart shows that the majority of Lancashire & Cumbria and Liverpool City Region Local Authorities were above the national figure, many of the Cheshire and Greater Manchester Local Authorities weren't.



Level of involvement/consultation:

When only including those who were involved in discussions, the chart shows that the North West closely matches the national trends. The North West data is positive in that we have a slightly higher percentage where the carer always felt they were involved, but conversely we have a slightly higher percentage who felt they were never involved.


This data does vary markedly from Local Authority to Local Authority however, as shown in the table below.

The Local Authorities that may have issues here are: Cheshire West and Chester, Manchester, Oldham, Tameside, Trafford and Lancashire.


These six Local Authorities have a worse than national average of people involved in discussions, and for those who actually were involved, they also have a lower percentage who felt they were always involved.

Conversely, there were seven Local Authorities who appear to perform particularly well in this regard. Bolton, Bury, Stockport, Blackburn, Blackpool, Halton and Knowsley all consulted a greater percentage than the national average, and when they did, they had a high percentage of carers who felt they were always consulted in decisions.



Question 19 – In addition to your caring role, please tell us which of the following also applies to you?

More than half of the carers surveyed in the last three surveys have been retired, and the percentage has stayed relatively consistent.




The North West breakdown for 2016/17 is very similar to that of the national picture. The minor differences are that the North West has a slightly lower percentage of carers who are retired, but a slightly higher percentage in either full-time or part-time employment.

Based on the responses provided, roughly 26% of carers in the North West are either employed or self-employed on a full or part time basis.

Question 20 – Thinking about combining paid work and caring, which of the following statements best describes your current situation?

The chart below focuses on 2016/17 data only, as the question had slightly different options in earlier years, so is not directly comparable. However, it does show that based on the responses, approximately one fifth of carers in the North West are not in employment specifically because of their caring responsibilities.




Two of the comparable options are below, and compares the North West to the national average for the last three surveys. Generally, in terms of not being in paid employment due to caring responsibilities, the North West is the same as the national average.

However, in terms of support from employers, the right had chart shows a positive and negative picture. Positive in that the North West has consistently outperformed the national average, but the only negative is that the percentage is in decline (from 13% in 2012/13 to 10.9% in 2016/17).





I am in paid employment and I feel supported by my employer (%)



Question 21 – About how long have you been looking after or helping the person you care for?


The two charts below (looking at North West data only) examine how long the carer has cared for the person they care for. The top chart focuses on 2016/17 data only, with the bottom being more general groupings, comparing the data from the last three surveys.





When placing the groups into more general bandings, it can be seen that less than 5 years is the most common for each of the last three surveys. However what the two charts show is the wide spread of years that people have been carers – there is no one year/band that is particularly greater than others, with more than a fifth being a carer for more than 20 years.

The data indicates that being a carer is a long term commitment, as less than 4% of respondents had been a carer for less than a year, and **40% being a carer for more than 10 years**.




Between 15 and 20 Years Greater than 20 Years

The chart above breaks down the 2016/17 data into sub regions and Local Authorities. The two obvious anomalies in the data are **Bolton** and **Wirral**.

Regionally, 36% of carers having been caring for less than 5 years, and most Local Authorities are within +/- 3% of this, whereas Bolton have just 13.8%; significantly lower than anywhere else. Conversely, for those caring for more than 20 years, Bolton is at almost three times the regional average. 58% of respondents said they care for more than 20 years, but only 21% regionally did.


Please note however, that Bolton's figures may be a data issue, so a degree of caution is taken with using the Bolton figures above. In the 2014/15 survey, Bolton followed the North West trend closely, so for such a big change from one survey to the next, this may be an anomaly and may not represent the whole borough.

With the Wirral, it is the opposite story, although the Wirral is not as big an outlier as Bolton. That chart shows that the Wirral has a much higher than average number of carers who have been caring for 5 years or less (nearly half), and much less for those caring for 20 years or more (only 11.6%, which is roughly half the North West average).



Question 22 – About how long do you spend each week looking after or helping the person you care for?

It is clear from the chart above that both regionally and nationally, carers give up a lot of their time in their caring role, with over a third caring for more than 100 hours every week.



* Please note that the chart above does not include 'Other' or Varies (+/- 20hrs per week). These typically account for 20% of responses.

The chart shows that when comparing the 2014/15 and 2016/17 surveys to the 2012/13 one, there has been a noticeable increase in those providing 100hrs+ per week, although this has remained fairly static over the last two surveys.

This coincides with less people now providing 0 - 19 hrs, which would indicate that people in the North West are dedicating more time to their caring role now than they were in 2012/13.
